The NSS unit of Vidya Academy of Science and Technology Technical Campus, Kilimanoor has successfully conducted the first community program for the academic year 2019 – 2020 on 26th July 2019 at 12:30 pm. REPORT ON REBUILD KERALA 8th August 2019

OBJECTIVE:

- To promote social responsibility among students
- To help people in flood affected area

REPORT:

Apart from the flood that occurred during the year 2018, on 8th August 2019, Kerala witnessed the terrifying fury of nature, in the form of landslides and cloudburst. As a security measure in the prevailing situation of heavy rains, the Government of Kerala had issued Red alert in the 9 districts in Northern and Central Kerala, orange alert in 3 districts of Central Kerala, and yellow alert in 2 districts of Southern Kerala. Thousands of people have been evacuated to safer places and relief camps. A total of 101 people lost their lives in the torrential downpour. The camps hosted more than 2 lakh people from various parts of the state. The NSS unit of VAST TC along with students took up the charge of extending a helping hand to those devastated. We donated lots of dress materials, water bottles, napkins, medicine, food items and cleaning materials, to the camps in several districts. Unfortunately, in 2019 we again faced the same situation not only flood but also severe landslides. We lost hundreds of lives and thousands of them were homeless. All the staff and students of our college have come together to lend a helping hand to the families affected by the flood in our state. The students of VAST TC also actively participated, and 44 students participated. The necessary materials were collected through the collection camp organised by the NSS unit of our college coordinated by Mr. Lenin Babu(NSS Program Officer). Our college bus and student volunteers reached the flood affected regions of Malappuram district, carrying the commodities collected from different engineering colleges in and around Thiruvananthapuram. Sri.Gopalakrishnan IAS District Collector (Tvm), flagged off the journey along with Mr. Anil Brahmanandan(Academic Advisor, VAST TC), Mr.Lenin Babu (NSS Program Officer, VAST TC), Mr.Sanoj Office, Superintendent(VAST TC), Mr. Chandu (Assistant Professor, ECE). REPORT ON FLOOD RELIEF MATERIAL DISTRIBUTION 18th August 2019

OBJECTIVE:

- To promote social responsibility among students
- To help people in flood affected area

REPORT:

The NSS Unit of VAST TC, Kilimanoor, collected essential materials such as medicines, baby food, sanitary napkins, undergarments, and dresses for gents, women and children, bottled water etc. from the areas like Kadakkal, Panappamkunnu, Thattathumala and Kilimanoor for the people adversely affected by the floods on 17th August 2019 and 18th August 2019. On 18th August 2019, all the materials collected were distributed by the volunteers at the flood relief camp at Pathanamthitta.

Total of 30 NSS volunteers participated in the program. They organized the event, collected the necessities in these two days, and helped load the items in the trucks to send them to the areas hit by the floods by 4 pm in the evening of 18th August 2019. The program was coordinated by the Programme Officer, Mr. Lenin Babu.



Students were able to provide all the necessary things to camp and everyone appreciated them for their efforts. Through this event they developed a sense of oneness and realized the importance of working for the community during challenging times.



REPORT ON KANIVU 2 25th September 2019

OBJECTIVE:

- To provide nutritious food to old age home
- To promote social responsibility among students

REPORT:

Even though India is a progressive nation, the fact still remains that India is home to the highest number of malnourished population in the world. Even though we are self-reliant in terms of food production, the condition of starvation is very persistent in the nation. In this situation, a program on food donation was organized on 25th September 2019 to collect food materials at VAST TC, Kilimanoor under National Service Scheme (NSS). The program was also organized to mark the golden jubilee anniversary of NSS. As part of our activities, the volunteers provided nutritious mid-day meals to the 40 elderly persons in Sarvodaya Santhi Bhavan at Vattappara. The program was conducted under the leadership of the NSS volunteer, Mr. Jijo. It was the second time that they conducted a mid-day meal by an NSS unit in the academic year. All the NSS volunteers of the college joined their hands in the successful fulfillment of mid-day meals. **15 NSS volunteers and Ms. Rini Madhavan Rajeev, Assistant Program Officer, arrived at Santhi Bhavan at 12:15 pm.** They supplied lunch (meals) at 12:45 pm. REPORT ON BLOOD DONATION DRIVE 30th September 2019

OBJECTIVE:

- To support the operation of safe and reliable blood services.

REPORT:

On 30th September 2019, NSS volunteers of VAST TC Kilimanoor, organized a Blood Donation Drive in association with General Hospital, Thiruvananthapuram, and a non- profit organization Kerala State Blood Transfusion Council, 'Blood Donation - Kerala'. A lady doctor from RCC, Thiruvananthapuram and staff reached the campus with the equipment required. The program commenced at 10 am in Lecture Hall SB 515, with our first donor and Program Officer Mr. Lenin Babu. A total of 50 units of blood were donated by the students who registered. **59 students took part in the event**. Mr. Lenin Babu coordinated the program, which ended at 3 pm.





Blood is the most precious gift that anyone can give to another person — the gift of life. A decision to donate blood can save a life or even several if the blood is separated into its components — red cells, platelets and plasma — it can be used individually for patients with specific conditions. REPORT ON GANDHI BHAVAN VISIT

1st December 2019

OBJECTIVE:

- To sensitize the students about the problems faced by the people who are alone
- To realize the agony and pain which the people go through in their life while living away from their dear ones.
- To provide them companionship and emotional support

REPORT:

The volunteers of NSS unit of VAST TC visited a charitable organization GANDHI BHAVAN, at 10 am, on 1st December of 2019. Gandhi Bhavan is situated on the banks of Kallada River at Kundayam, near Pathanapuram in Kollam District, Kerala, India. A registered non-government organization that is deeply devoted and dedicated to the destitute of beings ranging from kids to senior most citizens. They are abandoned by the very people they count on. There are the deranged who move without any destinations, the paraplegic and the bedridden, the physically, mentally and visually challenged, the HIV affected, the cancer patients, the TB patients, the people with suicidal ideation, orphan kids etc. 25 volunteers with the Program Officer visited the inhabitants of Gandhi Bhavan. They reached there at 10:00 am. The management and the inmates of Gandhi Bhavan gave a warm welcome to the entire team. As a part of the active participation and humble donations from the students and faculty of VAST TC, more than 500 dresses and cash were donated to them. The program was coordinated by Mr. Lenin Babu. There are around 700 people in the organization. There are many staff including nurses, social workers, other volunteers etc with the inmates. The inmates included old age people, mentally retarded children etc. The volunteers had an informal interaction with inmates and employees of Gandhi Bhavan. This was a thought provoking experience for them..



Visiting Gandhi Bhavan helped the students to realize how painful it is to get abandoned by dear ones. It also helped them realize the importance of helping the needy. They promised themselves that they would visit the organization occasionally and do whatever help they can.



REPORT ON PUNARJANI

25th January 2020, 2nd February 2020

OBJECTIVE:

- To promote social responsibility among students
- To make the hospital surrounding neat and clean
- To renovate the rusted things by painting

REPORT:

A Punarjani program was organized at Govt. Taluk Hospital Kadakkal under the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of VAST TC, Kilimanoor. The program was arranged to repair and repaint the worn out hospital equipment. The program was divided into two-day sessions.

Day 1:

During the first day on 25th January 2020, the first batch of **NSS volunteers consisting of 30 students** and under the guidance of NSS Program Officer Mr. Lenin Babu started the work at 10 a.m. The objective of our work on the first day was to be to polish all the rusted beds, stands and oxygen cylinders and to paint them. The program ended by 3 pm.

Day 2:

During the second day, on 2nd February 2020, the second batch **consisting 44 NSS volunteers**, under the guidance of NSS Program Officer Mr. Lenin Babu and Assistant Program Officer Ms. Rini Madhavan Rajeev, started the work at 10 a.m. The volunteers were divided into three groups. The first group was given the task of removing the moss off the wall and then painting it. The second group was tasked with repairing, polishing and painting the remaining beds and chairs. The third group was given the work to paint the walls of the Pediatric ward of the hospital, with

cartoon characters. **Total of 74 students participated in the program.** Students ended the work by 3:30 pm. The program was coordinated by Mr.Lenin Babu.



OUTCOME:

Students felt so happy and they appreciate the help of the hospital staff and thank them for providing the opportunity to help them.





REPORT ON VIMUKTHI

7th February 2020

OBJECTIVE:

- To aware the students about the bad impact of alcoholism and drug abuse
- To conduct the awareness campaign launched by Government of Kerala in the college

REPORT:

The Government has launched 'Vimukthi' (Kerala State Mission for De-addiction), a new project to conduct awareness campaigns against alcoholism and drug abuse. It is being implemented with the help of Student Police Cadets, anti- addiction clubs of schools and colleges, National Service Scheme, Kudumbasree, State Library council, anti- alcoholic organizations, different student, youth and women's organisations. Addiction free Kerala is the aim of this mission. Statewide campaigns to make students and youth aware of the evils of drug addiction and alcoholism were conducted. Drug use and abuse is a widespread problem that has a negative impact on the society. The use and abuse of illegal drugs are a health, social and law enforcement problem in the world.

On 7th February 2020, NSS cell of VAST TC Kilimanoor introduced Vimukthi into our college by conducting Vimukthi jwala at the college lobby. The program started at 9 am. The Program Officer of NSS Mr. Lenin Babu lighted the candles and passed them on to the volunteers. Soon after that Vimukthi pledge was taken. Some students created posters on drug abuse and it was exhibited in the college lobby. After this session, at 3 pm, the volunteers participated in the **Vimukthi jwala rally** conducted by the Excise department of Kerala in Kilimanoor private bus stand and also provided a awareness speech to the public by the NSS coordinator Mr.Lenin Babu. The program

was ended at 5 pm by a mime performance on drug abuse. **40 students participated in the program**. The program was coordinated by Mr.Lenin Babu.



Vimukthi is an anti-narcotics campaign launched by the Government of Kerala. It is a collective effort aims at eradicating all sorts of narcotic substances from Kerala. By this event, students were able to know about the campaign and were able to create awareness among the youth.

REPORT:
